Local Administrator Password Solution (LAPS) improvements

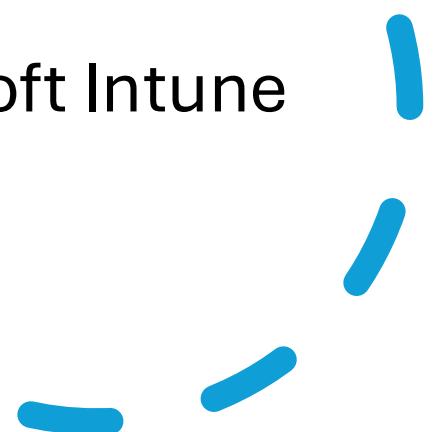
LAPS has a new automatic account management feature. IT admins can configure Windows LAPS to:

- Automatically create the managed local account
- Configure name of account
- Enable or disable the account
- Randomize the name of the account

- Intune Subscription – Microsoft Intune Plan 1



Device Hardware Inventory

Device Inventory for Windows

Device inventory lets you collect and view additional hardware properties from your managed devices to help you better understand the state of your devices and make business decisions.

You can now choose what you want to collect from your devices, using the catalog of properties and then view the collected properties in the Resource Explorer view.

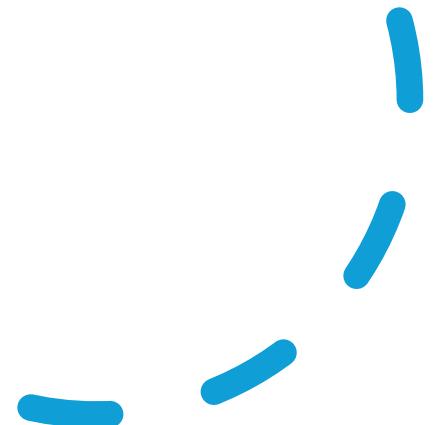

What are the licensing requirements for Windows Autopatch?

- Microsoft 365 Business Premium (for more information on available licenses, see Microsoft 365 licensing)
- Windows 10/11 Education A3 or A5 (included in Microsoft 365 A3 or A5)
- Windows 10/11 Enterprise E3 or E5 (included in Microsoft 365 F3, E3, or E5)
- Windows 10/11 Enterprise E3 or E5 VDA

What are the prerequisites for Windows Autopatch?

- Microsoft Intune (include Configuration Manager 2010 or greater via co-management)

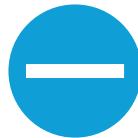

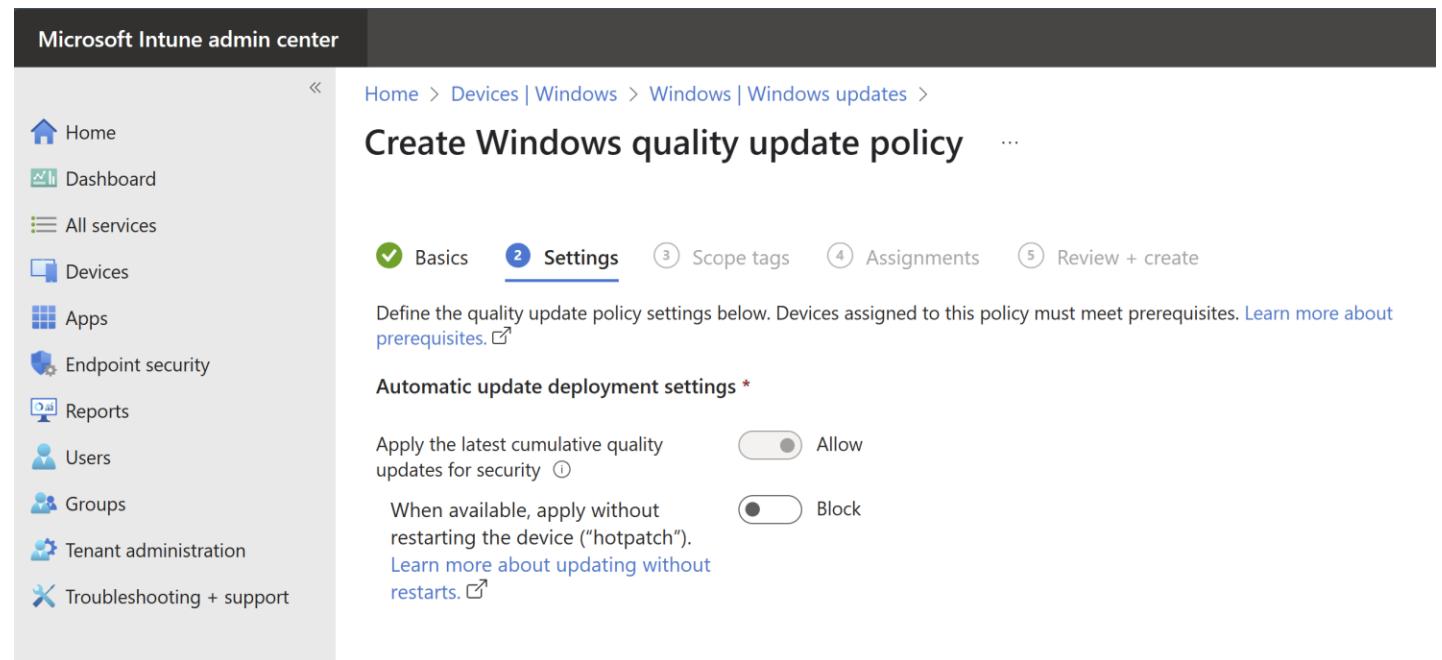
